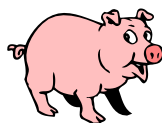


The 5Rs of Effective Learning

READINESS



- I show a 'have a go' attitude.
- I am ready to learn and believe I can do it.
- I know my learning targets.

RESOURCEFULNESS



- I can investigate and explore.
- I use what I already know to help me learn something new.
- I can try different approaches in my learning.

RESPONSIBILITY



- I can work well with others in my learning.
- I make good choices in my behaviour and learning.
- I try hard to improve and recognise my achievements.

RESILIENCE



- I can stick at a job.
- I can keep going even when I find work difficult.

REFLECTIVENESS



- I can think about what I am learning, and how to get better.
- I look back and make connections.

Each 'R' has an animal story associated with it:

Responsibility – The story of The Little Red Hen, who was responsible for making the bread.

Resourcefulness – The story of Anansi the spider, an African story of a spider who has to try new and different ways to get what he wants.

Readiness – The Story of the Three Little Pigs, based on the third little pig who thought ahead and was ready for the wolf each time.

Resilience – The story of the Hare and the Tortoise, based on the tortoise who kept on going and won the race.

Reflectiveness – The story of the Owl who was afraid of the dark, based on how the main character 'Plop' reflects back on what he hears and sees to enable him enjoy the dark.
